Q. Caroline, how is your confidence level?

CAROLINE WOZNIACKI: I feel like I'm playing very well. I'm very confident, and I've got some good results with my play; and I'm very happy about that.

Q. Did it feel like it was warmer out there today?

CAROLINE WOZNIACKI: I thought it was warmer yesterday, but I think because we had longer rallies yesterday. Today was more short points and we weren't running as much as I was yesterday.

Q. How are you going to spend the evening, Caroline? Shopping or anything fun?

CAROLINE WOZNIACKI: I don't know. Actually depends what time I get back to the hotel. I'm probably going to talk to Urszula Radwanska actually. She said she was going to wait for my call. And then just have a nice dinner, relax and enjoy.

My friend's flight just got canceled, so she's staying some more days, so we are probably going to just hang out.

Q. The other thing I was going to ask you, it seems like you're friendly with some of the players on Tour. Does that make it harder to play them or easier or do you just not think about it when you're on the court?

CAROLINE WOZNIACKI: When I'm on the court, I really don't think about it. Yeah, I have a lot of friends on the Tour, and there's a lot of nice girls out there. So it's nice that you have this friendship, you go out for dinner, you can just have fun, go to movies and relax.

And on the court, of course, both of us want to win and it's just focus on the ball and not who's on the other side of the net.

Q. Charleston has some really good restaurants. Have you gone to any you can mention?

CAROLINE WOZNIACKI: Yeah. We went to the Japanese restaurant called Wasabi and also Japanese restaurant called Sushi Hero and a steakhouse called Chops Steakhouse, very good. And we went to quite a few. So yeah. We've been around town.

Q. Daniela likes chocolate, and she likes sweet things when she eats a meal. Do you eat sweets?

CAROLINE WOZNIACKI: Yeah.

Q. Every meal?

CAROLINE WOZNIACKI: No. Not at every meal, but I like sweets, and it's nice to treat yourself sometimes, and I mean here the players lounge we have Nutella so I mean I like the Nutella, but I try to stay away from it, not to eat too much at least.

Q. Caroline, it seemed like -- now back to tennis, seemed like your play tapered off just a little bit after the US Open and then a little --

CAROLINE WOZNIACKI: Sorry. I didn't hear the question.

Q. Your play tapered off just a little bit, it sounded like your winning percentage went down a little bit after the US Open, but then the last three tournaments you're doing really well, your winning percentage has gone higher. Do you feel like you're doing something differently, consciously?

CAROLINE WOZNIACKI: After the US Open I played Tokyo and Beijing. I was sick in Tokyo, I had to retire in my match, and in Beijing I wasn't 100 percent. And I also think that the US Open really took a lot of energy out of me.

And I played Luxembourg. I just played one match there as well, and I played the Year-End Championships, which I mean it's a great championship, and I made it to the semi-finals. And I've only been playing big tournaments, so I feel like I've actually been doing good results this year. I'm really happy about the way I'm playing, the way I've been progressing and I feel like, yeah, I'm on the right track.
